**RE: REQUIREMENT TO SUBMIT ABATEMENT PLAN  
CHEVRON USA - MARK #13 DRILL PIT  
SECTION 3, TOWNSHIP 22 SOUTH, RANGE 37 EAST  
LEA COUNTY, NEW MEXICO**

Dear Mr. Anderson:

The Oil Conservation Division (OCD) has determined that, based on the notification submitted by Environmental Plus, Inc. on January 28, 2008, Chevron North America (Chevron) must submit a Stage 1 Abatement Plan in accordance with OCD's Rule 19 (19.15.1.19 NMAC) to investigate ground water contamination at its Chevron USA - Mark #13 drill pit located in Section 3, Township 22 South, Range 37 East, Lea County, New Mexico. The Stage 1 Abatement Plan proposal must be submitted to the OCD Santa Fe Office with a copy provided to the OCD Hobbs District Office and must meet of all the requirements specified in OCD Rule 19 (19.15.1.19 NMAC), including, but not limited to, the public notice and participation requirements specified in OCD Rule 19G. The Stage 1 Abatement Plan is due sixty (60) days from the receipt by Chevron of this written notice.

Chevron's Stage 1 Abatement Plan must meet all of the requirements specified in OCD Rule 19E.3, including, but not limited to, a site investigation work plan and monitoring program that will enable it to characterize the chloride release using an appropriate number of isoconcentration maps and cross sections and to provide the data necessary to select and design an effective abatement option.

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OCD reminds Chevron that it was required, pursuant to OCD Rule 116, to submit *immediate verbal notice and timely written notice* to OCD when it determined that ground water had been impacted. Chevron must submit OCD Form C-141 that documents the appropriate information and plans and any other relevant information, including all relevant details of the pit (fluids handled, dimensions, volume, dates of operations, liner thickness, *etc.*) and details of any actions that Chevron has already taken by no later than March 5, 2008.

Chevron's request to close the Mark #13 drill pit is hereby denied. After OCD has properly reviewed all the information that Chevron is required to submit, it will determine what action to require of Chevron with respect to the drill pit.
