Dear Mr. Papp:

Reference is made to your application dated August 2, 1993 for a non-standard South Blanco Tocito oil well location for your existing Rincon Unit Well No. 150 which was drilled in 1959 and dually completed in both the Blanco Mesaverde and Basin Dakota Pools at a standard gas well location 990 feet from the North and East lines (Unit A) of Section 6, Township 26 North, Range 6 West, NMPM, Rio Arriba County, New Mexico.

It is my understanding from your letter that the Mesaverde interval will be plugged and abandoned and recompleted to the Undesignated South Blanco Tocito Oil Pool.

By the authority granted me under the provisions of the Special Rules and Regulations for the South Blanco Tocito Oil Pool, as promulgated by Division Order No. R-1191, dated June 10, 1958, and Division Memorandum 4-86 dated June 2, 1986, the above-described unorthodox oil well location is hereby approved. Further, the N/2 NE/4 of said Section 6 shall be dedicated to said well forming a standard 80-acre oil spacing and proration unit for said pool.

Also, UNOCAL shall comply with all provisions of Division General Rule 112-A pertaining to dually completing the Basin Dakota Pool and the Undesignated South Blanco Tocito Oil pool in the subject well.
