Dear Mr. Thompson:

Reference is made to your application on behalf of the operator, Williams Production Company of Salt Lake City, Utah, dated March 22, 1996 for an unorthodox Blanco-Mesaverde "infill" gas well location on an existing non-standard 264.56-acre gas spacing and proration unit ("GPU") for said Blanco-Mesaverde Pool [approved by Division Administrative Order NSL-3511(NSP)], comprising all of irregular Section 6, Township 31 North, Range 5 West, NMPM, Rio Arriba County, New Mexico. Said GPU is currently dedicated to the Rosa Unit Well No. 72 (API No. 30-039-25509), located at a previously approved unorthodox gas well location [also approved by said Order NSL-3511(NSP)] 2315 feet from the South line and 620 feet from the East line (Unit I) of said irregular Section 6.

By the authority granted me under the provisions of Rule 2(d) of the "General Rules For The Prorated Gas Pools of New Mexico/Special Rules and Regulations For The Blanco-Mesaverde Pool", as promulgated by Division Order No. R-8170, as amended, the following described well to be drilled at an unorthodox "infill" gas well location in said Section 6 is hereby approved:

Rosa Unit Well No. 72-A 2455' FSL - 260' FWL (Lot 4/Unit K)

Further, both the Rosa Unit Well Nos. 72 and 72-A are to be dedicated to the subject GPU, further said wells and GPU will be subject to all existing rules, regulations, policies, and procedures applicable to prorated gas pools in Northwest New Mexico.
