Mr. Anthony Wiggins,

This is a courtesy notice that Condition 16 of your permit, GW-348, had a due date of November 27, 2009.

OCD will be waiting on results and work plan requested.

- **"16. OCD Inspections:** The OCD performed an initial inspection of this facility on November 20, 2008. Mr. Anthony Wiggins witnessed the inspection. All photographs referenced below are located in the attachment of this permit. As a result of this inspection OCD concluded the following:
 - 1. Photo 1 -5 & 9 15: Barrels are improperly placed and are not identified. Reference Condition 7 10 for details. Empty barrels should be recycled. If not possible they should be disposed of per Condition 6.
 - 2. Photo 6 8: The drainage system needs to be plugged. This is a direct discharge on to the ground and in to surface waters of the US. Owner/operator shall re-engineer this drainage system so that no effluent discharges directly to the ground. The secondary cement containment is porous and must be reworked to be an impermeable pad
 - 3. Photo 12 & 15 17: There are several areas on site that show signs of contamination. OCD requires that the owner/operator to analyze composite soil samples collected within its yard. Samples shall be tested for TPH, Chlorides and WQCC NMAC 20.6.2.3103, A., Except for Fluoride (F), Nitrates (NO₃ as N) Uranium and (U) Radioactivity: combined Radium 226 & Radium 228. Contact Mr. Brandon Powell prior to sampling. Samples shall be taken from the following areas:
 - (1) One composite sample around the empty barrel storage area. Reference photos 10 12.
 - (2) Two composite samples from the drainage area south of the chemical storage area. One near the protruding conduit and another from the canal, approximately 6 feet down gradient from the conduit. Reference photo 7 & 8.
 - (3) Two composite samples from the east side of shop area. Reference photos 14-17.

Owner/operator shall submit the testing results and work plan to address the above issues to OCD by **November 27, 2009**. Failure to do so will constitute a violation of the permit."




Photo 4: Chemical storage area with substance on floor.




Photo 5: Drainage in chemical storage area. Cement containment is wearing and is porous.

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


Photo 7: location SE of garage area. Appears to have materials removed.

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


Photo 9: Contaminated soils.

OCD (Brandon Powell & Leonard Lowe) found and inspected the facility on November 20, 2008. Mr. Anthony Wiggins accompanied OCD on inspection visit.

The inspection concluded the following concerns (photos are attached):

- 1. Housekeeping issues: Photo 1, 2, 3. Barrels empty or partially full are improperly placed. Photo 2 shows a discharge on to the ground of assumed hydrocarbon substance. Photo 3 shows a barrel assumed empty improperly placed near adjacent resident.
- 2. Questionable integrity of secondary containment and its drainage: Photos 4, 5, 6, 7. The OCD was informed that structure is fairly new. The cement floor appears to be porous, Photo 6, and is not curbed, Photo 5. Mr. Wiggins informed the OCD that the floor drainage is not yet complete. When the plumbing is completed the drain will be flowed to a nearby ditch drainage.
- 3. Empty/partially empty barrel storage is questionable: the new location of Chaco Chemical is on two properties separated by a few hundred feet. The property located on the west side is currently being used as a storage area. Empty barrels are stored in this area, see photos 8 11. Barrels are located directly on the ground. A few barrels and released contents on to the ground, photo 10.

At the conclusion of inspection the OCD informed Mr. Wiggins of the reason for inspection, referencing a discharge plan permit. The OCD informed Mr. Wiggins that we will submit a formal request for the application. Mr. Wiggins was willing to submit application.

The OCD will send information to Mr. Wiggins for a request of a discharge plan permit for this facility.



As of August 1, 2008 Chaco Chemical Company was never located and therefore still does not have a permit.




Photo 1: Closed gate facing the Chaco Chemical building and yard.
