


Describe Cause of Problem and Remedial Action Taken.* One fiberglass terminal tank was struck by lightning causing it to catch fire, thus releasing produced water to spill into the dike area

Describe Area Affected and Cleanup Action Taken.* The Monument Fire Department was called to extinguish the fire. Vacuum trucks were used to pick up the produced water, which was hauled to an EME SWD. The discharged fluid was completely contained within the tank dike area, which is designed for secondary containment. The facility is being replaced with steel terminal tanks.
