I have discussed the matter of Texaco Skelly "F" Release Site with our Bureau Chief, Wayne Price. We have concluded that if a plan for groundwater remediation for the above-referenced site is submitted to the OCD, then the site can remain under 19.15.29 NMAC (Part 29, formally, Rule 116). However, the plan must include a reasonable timeframe for remediation and must be submitted by April 13, 2009.
