The British-American Oil Producing Company, as operator of the North Wilson Deep Unit well No. 1, Lea County, New Mexico, respectfully requests administrative approval for an exception to Statewide Rule 104 concerning that portion amended by Order No. R-2707 effective May 25, 1964. The exception requested at this time is for a 160 acre non-standard gas proration unit for the above well which is completed in the Morrow sand of Pennsylvanian age.

The North Wilson Deep Unit well No. 1 was spudded on January 1, 1964, and is located 660' FSL and 1980' FEL of Section 31, T-20-S, R-35-E as shown on the attached plat. On June 6, 1964, the well was completed as a dual oil producer from the Upper and Lower Bone Springs. These two reservoirs have become depleted and in October, 1964, the well was recompleted from perforations 11,353' to 11,376' in a Morrow gas sand. The open flow potential from this zone was 10,700 MCFPD.

Contracts have been signed for the sale of this gas to Phillips Petroleum Company and Warren Petroleum Company. Phillips has made pipeline connections and Warren will connect in the near future. When Order No. R-2707 became effective, this well became an unorthodox location for a standard 320 acre gas proration unit. Because it will be necessary to hold a hearing for an exception to the unorthodox location and since this will require some time and it is desirable that gas sales be commenced as soon as possible, the above exception has been requested. If this exception is granted, immediate gas sales will be started and preparations will be made to apply for a hearing to obtain an exception for a non-standard location on a 320 acre gas proration unit.
