The New Mexico Oil Conservation Division (OCD) has received Plains' report and request for soil closure of the above-referenced site (dated August 2010). The above-referenced report, submitted in partial fulfillment of 19.15.30.19 NMAC (Part 30.19, formally, Rule 19.K), indicates that Plains has partially met the requirements of 19.15.30.9 NMAC for this site. Therefore, the OCD hereby conditionally approves the Soil Closure Request for the Lovington Gathering WTI Release Site and no further soil remediation is required for this site:

The Plains Lovington Gathering WTI Release Site is still active under Abatement Plan, AP-96, and groundwater monitoring, further groundwater contamination delineation if warranted, and groundwater remediation must continue at the Plains Lovington Gathering WTI Release Site.

As we discussed during our conference call last week, Plains respectfully requests an extension of 90 days to submit an amended Stage 2 Abatement Plan to address dissolved issues at this site. Basin Environmental personnel are currently conducting weekly site visits to over pump groundwater from selected monitor wells. If approved, Plains would use the 90 day extension to review the analytical data for the 2nd Quarter and 3rd Quarter 2010 groundwater sampling events so that the effectiveness of the over pumping activities can be evaluated and a suitable course of action for addressing the dissolved phase issues can be determined.

Notice is hereby given that pursuant to New Mexico Oil Conservation Division Regulations Commission Rules (19.15.30 NMAC), the following Stage 1 and Stage 2 Abatement Plan Proposals have been submitted to the Director of the Oil Conservation Division, 1220 St. Francis Drive, Santa Fe, New Mexico, 87505, Telephone (505) 476-3440:

Plains All American Pipeline Marketing, L.P., Jason Henry, Remediation Coordinator, Telephone (575) 441-1099, 3112 W. US Hwy 82, Lovington, New Mexico 88260 has submitted a Stage 1 and Stage 2 Abatement Plan Proposal for the Lovington Gathering WTI leak site, located in Unit Letter H of Section 6, Township 17 South, Range 37 East, NMPM, Lea County, New Mexico. Plains All American Pipeline Marketing, L.P. operates a crude oil pipeline at the site. An estimated volume of 12 barrels of crude oil was released from a pipeline at the site. Crude oil and benzene contamination in excess of the New Mexico Water Quality Control Commission standards has been observed in groundwater at the site. The Stage 1 and Stage 2 Abatement Plan Proposal presents the following activities: designate a responsible person relative to plan submittal, describes and maps the site, provides historical information including previous investigation, characterizes the site as to geology and hydrogeology; determines vertical and horizontal extent and magnitude of vadose zone and groundwater contamination, determines rate and direction of contamination migration, provides inventory of water wells in the vicinity, provided location and number of wells actually or potentially affected by the pollution, defined surface water hydrology, determined seasonal stream flow characteristics, determined groundwater/surface water relationships, determined the vertical and horizontal extent and magnitude of contamination, establishes a monitoring program, establishes a Quality Assurance Plan, soil and groundwater remediation strategies, and surface restoration strategies.

Any interested person may obtain further information from the Oil Conservation Division and may submit to the Director of the Oil Conservation Division, at the address given above, written comments or a written request for a public hearing that includes reasons why a hearing should be held. The Stage 1 and Stage 2 Abatement Plan Proposals may be viewed at the above address or at the Oil Conservation Division Hobbs District Office, 1625 North French Drive, Hobbs, New Mexico 88240, telephone (575) 393-6161, between 8:00 a.m. and 4:00 p.m., Monday through Friday or may also be viewed at the Oil Conservation Division Division Website: http://www.emnrd.state.nm.us/ocd/. Prior to ruling on the proposed Stage 1 and Stage 2 Abatement Plan Proposals, the Director of the Oil Conservation Division shall allow at least thirty (30) days after the date of publication of this notice during which written comments or a written request for a hearing may be submitted.
