Reference is made to the following:

(a) your application (**administrative application reference No. pTGW10-21029764**) submitted to the New Mexico Oil Conservation Division (the Division) in Santa Fe, New Mexico on July 29, 2010, and

(b) the Division's records pertinent to this request.

XTO Energy Inc. (XTO) has requested to drill the above-referenced well at an unorthodox gas well location, as described above in the caption of this letter. The NW/4 of Section 1 will be dedicated to this well in order to form a standard 160-acre gas spacing unit in the Otero-Chacra Gas Pool (82329). This pool is governed by statewide Rule 15.10.C, which provides for 160-acre units, with wells located at least 660 feet from a unit outer boundary. This location is less than 660 feet from the southern unit boundary.

Your application has been duly filed under the provisions of Division Rules 15.13 and 4.12.A(2).
