Re: Surface Commingling Application

Dear Mr. Martin:

This letter acknowledges the receipt of your administrative application to surface commingle the gas production from the Abrams "J" No. 1, Abrams Gas Com "D" No. 1 and the Keys Gas Com "D" No. 1E. The Division received your application on August 15, 2001.

Our preliminary review indicates that the information provided in the application is not sufficient to process the administrative order. The following information is necessary:

- a) **Administrative Application Checklist (Enclosed)**
- b) **What types of leases are involved (i.e. Federal, Fee, etc.) If federal leases are involved, has this commingling request been submitted to the BLM?**
- c) **What acreage is dedicated to each of the wells in each of the pools?**
- d) **Is the interest ownership common between the wells?**
- e) **A list of interest owners to which notice was provided.**

Since the submitted information is insufficient to review, the application was **Ruled Incomplete** on August 22, 2001. Please submit the above stated information by August 29, 2001.

The Division cannot proceed with your application until the required information is submitted. Upon receipt, the division will continue to process your application. The additional information can be faxed, or mailed to the Division. If the necessary information is not submitted, your application will be returned to you.
