This order supersedes Administrative Order NSL-6220 in its entirety.

Reference is made to the following:

(a) your application (administrative application reference No. pTGW10-31642753) submitted to the New Mexico Oil Conservation Division (the Division) in Santa Fe, New Mexico on November 12, 2010, and

(b) the Division's records pertinent to this request.

COG Operating, LLC [OGRID 229137] (COG) has requested to drill the abovereferenced well at an unorthodox oil well location, described above in the caption of this letter. The NE/4 NW/4 of Section 21 will be dedicated to this well in order to form a standard 40-acre oil spacing and proration unit in the West Maljamar Yeso Pool (44500). This pool is governed by statewide Rule 15.9.A, which provides for 40-acre units, with wells located at least 330 feet from a unit outer boundary. This location is less than 330 feet from the southern unit boundary.

Your application has been duly filed under the provisions of Division Rules 15.13 and 4.12.A(2).
