Lime Rock Resources A, L.P is hereby authorized to surface commingle oil and gas production from Empire; Glorieta-Yeso Oil Pool (**96210**) from the following State Leases and wells.

Wells: AID 24 STATE Well No.7 (**API No. 30-015-38187**), Unit M, Sect. 24, T-17-S, R-28 E.

AID 24 STATE Well No. 9 (**API No. 30-015-38188**), Unit N, Section 24, T-17-S, R-28-E

AID 24 STATE Well No. 10 (API No. 30-015-38190, Unit O, Section 24, T-17-S, R-28-E.

AID 24 STATE Well No. 11, (API No. 30-015-38189), Unit N, Section 24 T-17-S, R-28-E

### **All in NMPM, Eddy County, New Mexico**

Commingled oil and gas production from the wells detailed above shall be measured and sold at the Central Delivery Point (CDP), located in Unit N, Section 24, Township 17 South, Range 28 East, NMPM, Eddy County, New Mexico.

Oil and gas production from each well shall be continuously measured with allocation meters before commingling with production from other wells. The oil and gas allocation meters shall be calibrated quarterly.


NOTE: This installation shall be installed and operated in accordance with the applicable Division Rules and Regulations. It is the responsibility of the producer to notify the transporter of this commingling authority.



FURTHER: The operator shall notify the Artesia District office of the Division prior to implementation of commingling operations.
