Re: Application of Continental Oil Company for permission to commingle in a common tank battery oil produced from its State 25 and State 25 "A" leases in Section 25, T-20-S, R-37-E, Hardy Pool, Lea County, New Mexico (State Leases Nos. B-11349 and E-1402)

Gentlemen:

Continental Oil Company respectfully requests administrative approval under the provisions of Rule 309 (A) of the Rules and Regulations of the New Mexico Oil Conservation Commission to commingle in common tankage oil produced from its State 25 (State Lease No. B-11349) and State 25 "A" (State Lease No. E-1402) leases, located in Section 25, T-20-S, R-37-E, Lea County, New Mexico.

The State 25 lease (State Lease No. B-11349) covers among other lands, 80 acres, consisting of the S/2 SE/4 Section 25, T-20-S, R-37-E, Lea County, New Mexico, and has two oil wells on said 80 acres producing from the Queen pay in the Hardy Pool. The State 25 "A" lease (State Lease No. E-1402) covers 40 acres, consisting of the SE/4 SW/4 Section 25, T-20-S, R-37-E, Lea County, New Mexico, and has one oil well producing from the Queen pay in the Hardy Pool.

In support of this request, the following information is submitted:

1. The two subject state leases are dedicated to a common beneficiary.
2. The three aforesaid wells on the above described lands, covered by the two aforesaid leases, are producing from a common source of supply.
3. Only the three units assigned to the aforesaid three wells, respectively, will produce into the proposed common tank battery, and adequate facilities will be provided for accurately determining production from each of said three wells at reasonable intervals.
4. All owners of adjoining oil and gas leases have consented in writing to the proposed commingling of oil from the aforesaid separate leases, and written consent from each such owner is attached.
5. The State Land Commissioner has approved the commingling of oil from the aforesaid leases, and a copy of his letter of approval was forwarded to your office.
6. All of the acreage contained in the two aforesaid tracts of 80 acres and 40 acres, respectively, covered by the aforesaid two separate state leases, is contiguous.

In view of the above, it is respectfully requested that the Secretary-Director of the New Mexico Oil Conservation Commission grant an exception to Rule 309 (a) and permit the production of oil from the two aforesaid contiguous tracts of 80 acres and 40 acres, respectively, covered by the aforesaid two separate state oil and gas leases, into a common tank battery.
