Gentlemen:

I hereby make application to commingle oil produced
from Cockburn-Gulf State 1-2-3, State Leases B-8459
and E-7713, covering N $\frac{1}{2}$ SW $\frac{1}{4}$ and NW $\frac{1}{4}$ SE $\frac{1}{4}$ Section 13,
13S-31E, Chaves County.

These three wells are producing less than 25 barrels
of crude per day, and feel that a battery of two, two-
hundred and fifty barrel tanks should be sufficient, at
present there are four 250 Bbl tanks on lease.

E. S. Walker, previous Land Commissioner had granted
permission for commingling. The Commissioners letters
were dated October 19 and 26, 1955 addressed to the
Gulf Oil Corporation.

Photostatic copies of Mr. Walker's letters were furnished
me by the Gulf Oil Corp, and they were attached to my
letter of Application which was filed with the Hobbs
Oil Commission (Have contacted Hobbs, they failed to find
my original application). Therefore I sincerely request
your department to Contact the New Mexico Land Office
