Gentlemen;

This constitutes a request for an exception to Oil Conservation Commission Rule 309 (a) to permit the commingling of production from two separate State leases. The following information is furnished in satisfaction of the requirements of Rule 309 (b):

1. The leases subject to this request are contiguous, being further described as:

State Lease No. B-1969, insofar as it covers the NE/4 NW/4 Sec. 22-17S-28E

State Lease No. B-1111, insofar as it covers the NW/4 NE/4 Sec. 22-17S-28E, all in Eddy County, New Mexico.

2. Production from the wells located on the above described leases is from the same common source of supply, being the Grayburg formation (Premier Sand), Red Lake Field.
3. No more than two producing units will be produced into the common tank battery and accurate measurement of production from each unit may be made at reasonable intervals as required by the rule of the Oil Conservation Commission.
4. The ownership of the leases is common throughout.
5. Attached herewith are copies of letters wherein the owners of interest in the above leases consent to the commingling of production from the two leases.
