Gentlemen:

Reference is made to your application dated October 21, 1960, for administrative approval of an exception to Rule 309 (a) of the Rules and Regulations of the Oil Conservation Commission to permit the commingling of the oil produced from the following described State of New Mexico oil and gas leases from the Seven Rivers Formation into one tank battery and to permit the commingling of the oil produced from the same leases from the Grayburg formation into another tank battery:

State Lease E-1059, SW/4 NE/4

State Lease B-8318, SE/4 NW/4

**all in Section 36, Township 17 South, Range 27 East, NMPM,
Eddy County, New Mexico.**

By the authority vested in me under the provisions of Rule 309 (b) of the Rules and Regulations of the Oil Conservation Commission of New Mexico, I hereby authorize you to commingle the production in the manner described above.

Nothing contained herein shall be construed as authorizing the production of more than sixteen wells into a single tank battery.
