Gentlemen:

Reference is made to your application dated October 21, 1960, for administrative approval of an exception to Rule 309 (a) of the Rules and Regulations of the Oil Conservation Commission to permit the commingling of the oil produced from the Mescalero-Devonian Pool, from a:

State Lease consisting of the NE/4 NW/4 of Section 27, Township 10 South, Range 32 East, NMPH, Lea County, New Mexico, and from State Lease OG-5545.

By the authority vested in me under the provisions of Rule 309 (b) of the Rules and Regulations of the Oil Conservation Commission of New Mexico, I hereby authorize you to commingle the above-mentioned production in a common tank battery.

Nothing contained herein shall be construed as authorizing the production of more than sixteen wells into a single tank battery.
