Reference is made to your application dated February 20, 1963, for administrative approval of an exception to Rule 309-A of the Commission Rules and Regulations to permit the commingling of oil produced from your USA Ernest LC 062269-E Lease and your U.S. Smelting-USA LC 062269-A Lease comprising the NW/4 NW/4 of Section 23, Township 24 South, Range 32 East, and the W/2 NW/4, W/2 NE/4, E/2 SW/4, and E/2 SE/4 of Section 22, Township 24 South, Range 32 East, respectively, Double X Delaware Pool, Lea County, New Mexico, after separately metering the production from each lease.
