Gentlemen:

Reference is made to your application dated July 11, 1963, for administrative approval of an exception to Rule 309-A of the Commission Rules and Regulations to parallel the commingling of Queen-Grayburg production from State Lease 645 Education the B/2 SW/4 and SW/4 SW/4 of Section 11, all of Section 34. The S/2 ME/4, B/2 SW/4, and SE/4 of Section 15, and the ME/4 of Section 22; State Lease E-5136 comprising the H/2 MW/4 and SW/4 MM/4 of Section 23; and State Lease E-5003 comprising the ME/4 ME/4 of Section 15, all in Township 19 South, Range 28 East, Eddy County, New Mexico.

It is our understanding that although the ownership of these three leases is not common throughout, they are covered by a lease consolidation and pooling agreement which provides for the allocation of production and the transfer of allowables within a waterflood project area. Further, that the Commissioner of Public Lands for the State of New Mexico has consented, in writing, to the pooling agreement and to the proposed commingling of production.

Under the authority granted me pursuant to Rule 309-B, International Oil & Gas Corporation as operator of the lands covered by said lease consolidation and pooling agreement is hereby authorized to commingle the production from the aforesaid separate State leases, allocating production in accordance with the agreement.
