
Gentlemen:

We are, by this letter and enclosed documents, making application for permission to commingle San Andres crude from the State "FMA" and State "FMB" Leases, Flying "M" Field, Lea County, New Mexico. As can be seen in the enclosed schematic, we propose to commingle these leases without separate measurement. Verbal approval was obtained on November 2, 1964, from Romulo Martinez of the State Land Department, and a letter so stating is forthcoming.

We have thus far completed two top allowable wells on the State "FMA" Lease and one top allowable well on the State "FMB". Since completion gravity ranges between 19.4° and 20.8°, we anticipate no significant change in revenue as a result of commingling.

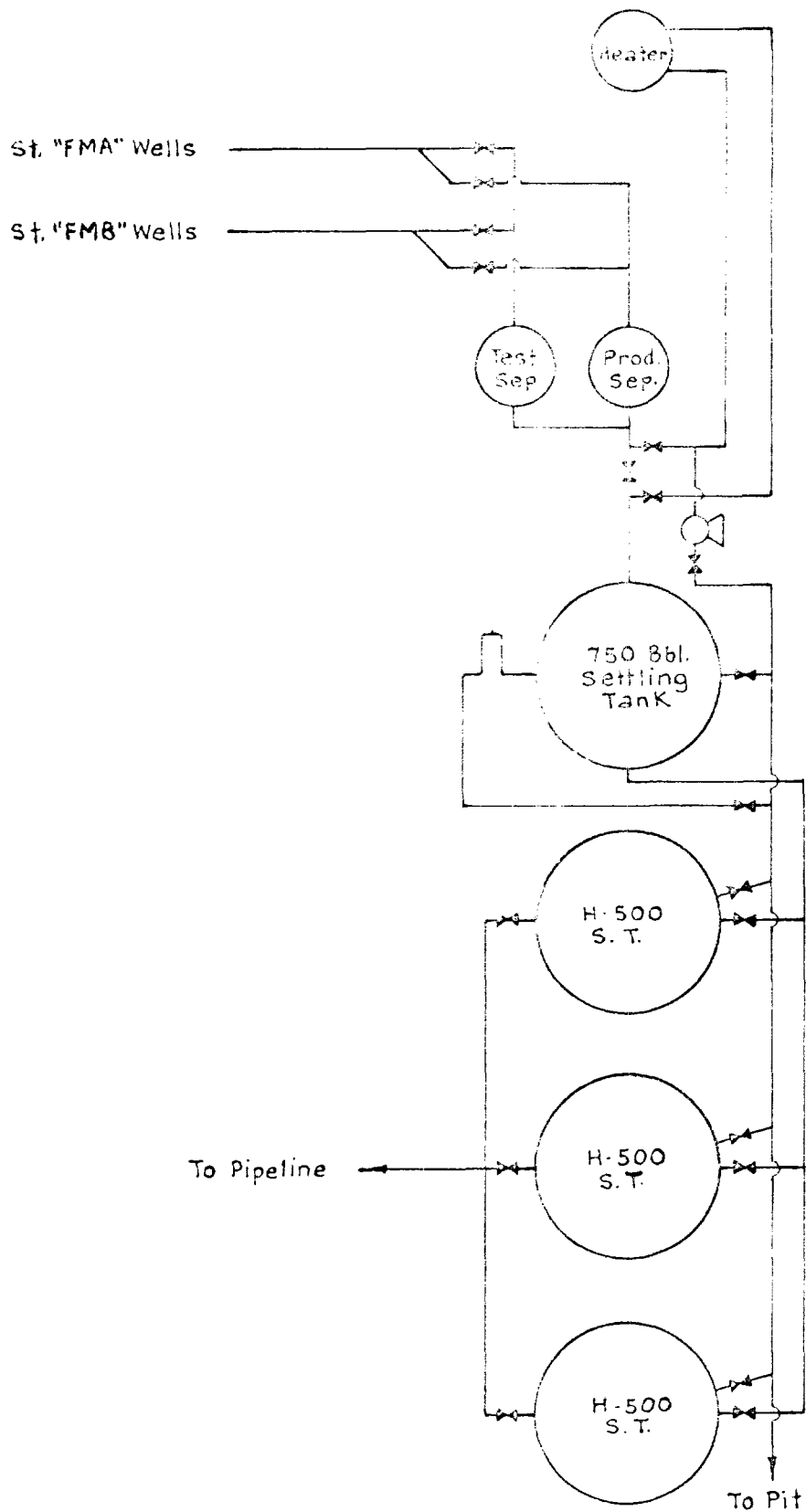
In view of the above presented information, we request that our previous application of October 13, 1964, be superseded by this letter and enclosures, on which we are requesting your approval.

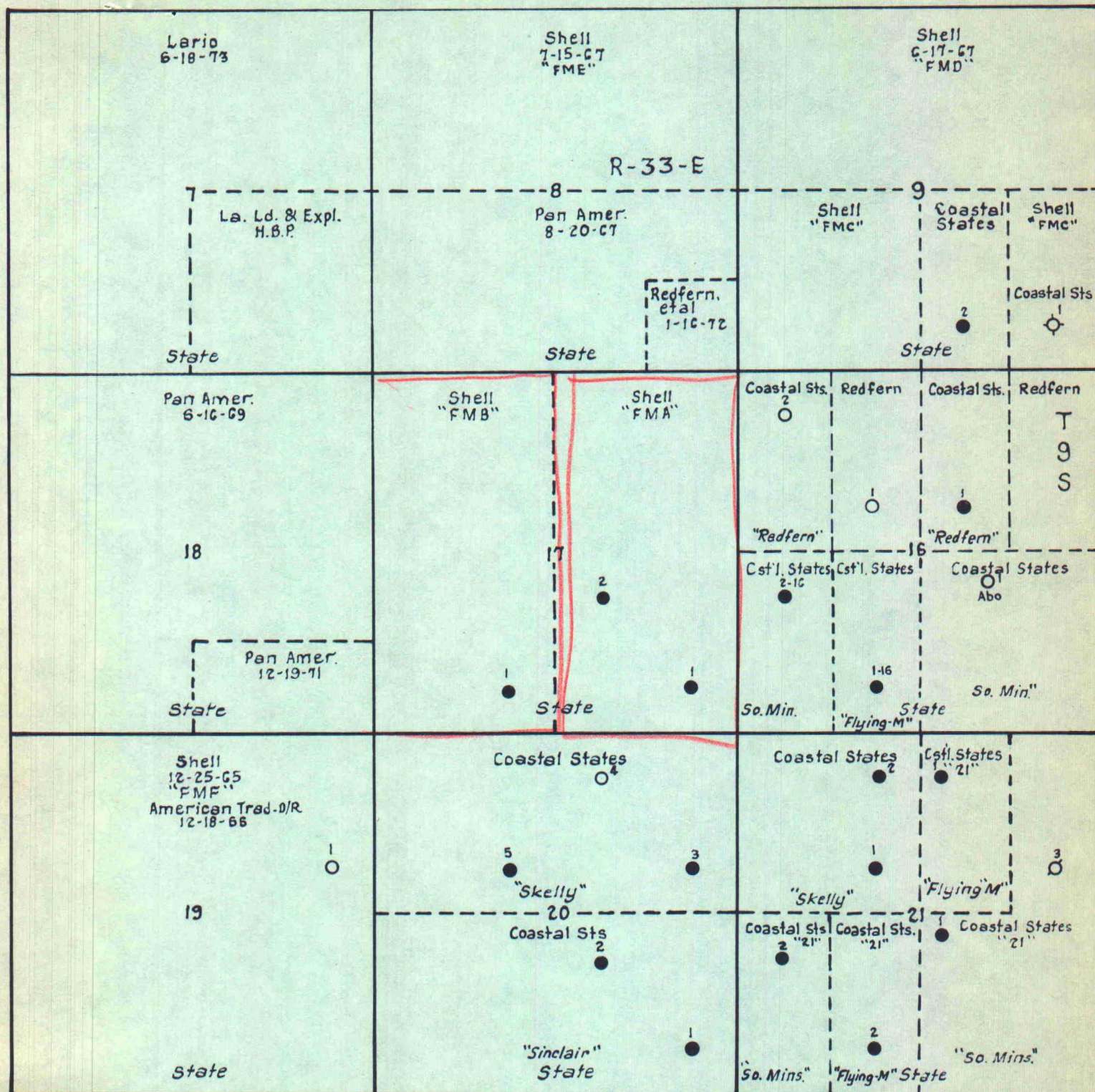
