ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER
OF THE OIL CONSERVATION COMMISSION

Under the provisions of Order No. R-1456, John H. Trigg Company, has made application to the Commission on March 28, 1961, for permission to expand its Trigg Water Flood Project in the Caprock-Queen Pool, Chaves County, New Mexico.

NOW, on this 12th day of April, 1961, the Secretary-Director finds:

1. That application has been filed in due form.
2. That satisfactory information has been provided that all offset operators have been duly notified of the application.
3. That no objection has been received within the waiting period as prescribed by Order No. R-1456.
4. That the proposed injection well is eligible for conversion to water injection under the terms of Order No. R-1456.
5. That the proposed expansion of the above-referenced water flood project will not cause waste nor impair correlative rights.
6. That the application should be approved.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

That the applicant, John H. Trigg Company, be and the same is hereby authorized to inject water into the Queen formation through the following described well for purposes of secondary recovery, to wit:

Federal Trigg No. 30-4 located in the NW/4 SW/4 of
Section 4, Township 14 South, Range 31 East, NMPM.

PROVIDED HOWEVER, That applicant shall inject water through tubing with a packer set well below the top of the cement outside the oil string of said well.
