## ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER OF THE OIL CONSERVATION COMMISSION

Under the provisions of Rule 701, Newmont Oil Company has made application to the Commission on September 6, 1962, for permission to expand its Loco Hills Grayburg Water Flood Project in the Loco Hills Pool, Eddy County, New Mexico.

NOW, on this 21st day of September, 1962, the Secretary-Director finds:

- That application has been filed in due form.
- That satisfactory information has been provided that all offset operators have been duly notified of the application.
- 3. That no objection has been received within the waiting period as prescribed by Rule 701.
- That the proposed injection well is eliqible for conversion to water injection under the terms of Rule 701.
- That the proposed expansion of the above-referenced water flood project will not cause waste nor impair correlative rights.
  - That the application should be approved.

## IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

That the applicant, Newmont Oil Company, be and the same is hereby authorized to inject water into the Grayburg formation through the following described well for purposes of secondary recovery, to wit;

Scheurich Well No. 9 located in the NW/4 SW/4 of Section 32, Township 17 South, Range 30 East, NMPM.

PROVIDED HOWEVER, That the oil string shall be set at the top of the oil zone and cemented with a minimum of 100 sacks cement and shall be successfully pressure-tested to a pressure in excess of the maximum injection pressure anticipated.

Done at Santa Fe, New Mexico, on the day and year hereinabove designated.
