ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER OF THE OIL CONSERVATION COMMISSION

Under the provisions of Rule 701, Union Oil Company of California has made application to the Commission on June 28, 1965, for permission to expand its South Caprock Queen Unit Water Flood Project in the Caprock-Queen Pool, Chaves County, New Mexico.

NOW, on this 13th day of July, 1965, the Secretary-Director finds:

- 1. That application has been filed in due form.
- 2. That satisfactory information has been provided that all offset operators have been duly notified of the application.
- 3. That no objection has been received within the waiting period as prescribed by Rule 701.
- 4. That the proposed injection well is eligible for conversion to water injection under the terms of Rule 701.
- 5. That the proposed expansion of the above-referenced water flood project will not cause waste nor impair correlative rights.
 - 6. That the application should be approved.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

That the applicant, Union Oil Company of California, be and the same is hereby authorized to inject water into the Queen formation through the following described well for purposes of secondary recovery, to wit:

Tract 48, Well 12-29 located in the NW/4 SW/4 of Section 29, Township 15 South, Range 31 East, NMPM,

PROVIDED HOWEVER, That applicant shall inject water through tubing with a packer set at approximately 3050 feet in the $5-\frac{1}{2}$ inch casing in said well.
