ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER OF THE OIL CONSERVATION COMMISSION

Under the provisions of Order No. R-2990, Windfohr Oil Company has made application to the Commission on October 28, 1968, for permission to expand its Grayburg Jackson WBA Water Flood Project in the Grayburg-Jackson Pool, Eddy County, New Mexico.

NOW, on this 12th day of November, 1968, the Secretary-Director finds:

1. That application has been filed in due form.

2. That satisfactory information has been provided that all offset operators have been duly notified of the application.

3. That no objection has been received within the waiting period as prescribed by Order No. R-2990.

4. That the proposed injection well is eligible for conversion to water injection under the terms of Order No. R-2990.

5. That the proposed expansion of the above-referenced water flood project will not cause waste nor impair correlative rights.

6. That the application should be approved.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

That the applicant, Windfohr Oil Company, be and the same is hereby authorized to inject water into the Grayburg formation through the following described well for purposes of secondary recovery, to wit:

Jackson "B" Well No. 25 located in Unit P of Section 24, Towsnhip 17 South, Range 30 East, NMPM.

PROVIDED HOWEVER, That the applicant shall inject water thru tubing with a packer set at approximately 3000 feet in the production casing in said well.
