APPLICATION OF TEXACO, U.S.A. TO EXPAND ITS WATERFLOOD PROJECT IN THE VACUUM GRAYBURG-SAN ANDRES POOL IN LEA COUNTY, NEW MEXICO

ORDER No. WFX-507

ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER OF THE OIL CONSERVATION DIVISION

Under the provisions of Order No. R-4234 Texaco has made application to the Division on March 7, 1983, for permission to expand its West Vacuum Unit Waterflood Project in the Vacuum Grayburg-San Andres Pool in Lea County, New Mexico.

NOW, on this 11th day of March, 1983, the Division Director finds:

- 1. That application has been filed in due form.
- 2. That satisfactory information has been provided that all offset operators have been duly notified of the application.
- 3. That no objection has been received within the waiting period as prescribed by Rule 701B.
- 4. That the proposed injection well is eligible for conversion to water injection under the terms of Rule 701.
- 5. That the proposed expansion of the above referenced waterflood project will not cause waste nor impair correlative rights.
 - 6. That the application should be approved.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

That the applicant, Texaco, U.S.A., be and the same is hereby authorized to inject water into the Vacuum Grayburg-San Andres formations through plastic-lined tubing set in a packer at approximately 4480 feet in the following described well for purposes of secondary recovery to wit:

West Vacuum Unit Well No. 55 Section 3, Township 18 South, Range 34 East, NMPM, Lea County, New Mexico

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED:

That the operator shall take all steps necessary to ensure that the injected water enters only the proposed injection interval and is not permitted to escape to other formations or onto the surface.

That the casing-tubing annulus (in each well) shall be loaded with an inert fluid and equipped with a pressure gauge at the surface or left open to the atmosphere to facilitate detection of leakage in the casing, tubing, or packer.

That the injection well or system shall be equipped with a pressure limiting device which will limit the wellhead pressure to a maximum of 924 pounds per square inch; provided however that the Division Director may administratively authorize a pressure limitation in excess of the above upon the operator's establishing that such higher pressure will not result in fracturing of the confining strata. This can be accomplished by providing the Oil Conservation Division office with step-rate data satisfactory to this office.

That the operator shall notify the supervisor of the Division's Hobbs District Office before injection is commenced through said well.

That the operator shall immediately notify the Supervisor of the Division's Hobbs District Office of the failure of the tubing, casing, or packer in said well or the leakage of water from or around said well and shall take such steps as may be timely or necessary to correct such failure or leakage.

That the subject well shall be governed by all provisions of Division Order No. R-4234 and Rules 702, 703, 704, 705, and 706 not inconsistent herewith.
