ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER OF THE OIL CONSERVATION DIVISION

Under the provisions of Order No. R-4934, Amoco Production Company has made application to the Division on March 10, 1980, for permission to expand its South Hobbs GSA Unit Pressure Maintenance Project in the Hobbs GSA Pool in Lea County, New Mexico.

 ${\tt NOW},$ on this 15th day of April, 1980, the Division Director finds:

- 1. That application has been filed in due form.
- 2. That satisfactory information has been provided that all offset operators have been duly notified of the application.
- 3. That no objection has been received within the waiting period as prescribed by Order No. R-4934.
- 4. That the proposed injection well is eligible for conversion to water injection under the terms of Order No. R-4934.
- 5. That the proposed expansion of the above referenced pressure maintenance project will not cause waste nor impair correlative rights.
 - 6. That the application should be approved.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

That the applicant, Amoco Production Company, be and the same is hereby authorized to inject water into the San Andres formations through plastic-lined tubing set in a packer at approximately 3900 feet in the following described well for purposes of pressure maintenance, to wit:

South Hobbs Unit Well No. 115 in Unit I of Section 6, Township 19 South, Range 38 East, Lea County, New Mexico, and through plastic-lined tubing set in a packer at approximately 3850 feet in the following described well for purposes of pressure maintenance, to wit:

South Hobbs Unit Well No. 113 in Unit J of Section 6, Township 19 South, Range 38 East, NMPM, Lea County, New Mexico, and through plastic lined tubing set in a packer at approximately 3900 feet in the following described well for purposes of pressure maintenance, to wit:

South Hobbs Unit Well No. 50 in Unit M of Section 5, Township 19 South, Range 38 East, NMPM, Lea County, New Mexico, and through plastic lined tubing set in a packer at approximately 3800 feet in the following described well for purposes of pressure maintenance, to wit:

South Hobbs Unit Well No. 27 in Unit E of Section 5, Township 19 South, Range 38 East, NMPM, Lea County, New Mexico.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED:

That the operator shall take all steps necessary to ensure that the injected water enters only the proposed

injection interval and is not permitted to escape to other formations or onto the surface.

That the casing-tubing annulus shall be loaded with an inert fluid and equipped with a pressure gauge at the surface or left open to the atmosphere to facilitate detection of leakage in the casing, tubing, or packer.

That the injection well or system shall be equipped with a pop-off valve or device which will limit the wellhead pressure to a maximum of 800 pounds per square inch; provided however that the Division Director may administratively authorize a pressure limitation in excess of the above upon the operator's establishing that such higher pressure will not result in fracturing of confining strata.

That the operator shall notify the supervisor of the Division's Hobbs District Office before injection is commenced through said well.

That the operator shall immediately notify the Supervisor of the Division's Hobbs District Office of the failure of the tubing, casing, or packer in said well or the leakage of water from or around said well and shall take such steps as may be timely or necessary to correct such failure or leakage.
