Second: In the event my wife, Minnie Scott Levick, survives me and does not die as a result of a common disaster or accident with me, then I give, devise and bequeath unto my said wife, all of the property owned by me at the time of my death of whatsoever nature and wheresoever situate.

Third: If my wife, Minnie Scott Levick, does not survive me, or if she dies in or as a result of a common disaster or accident with me, then I give, devise and bequeath all of the property owned by me at the time of my death, of whatsoever nature and wheresoever situate, absolutely and in fee simple unto my two children, Kenneth S. Schmidt, in equal shares, share and share alike; provided, however, that in the event either or both of my said children should predecease me, then the share that would otherwise have gone to such deceased child, shall vest absolutely in the heirs of such deceased child who are surviving at the time of my death, in equal shares, share and share alike.

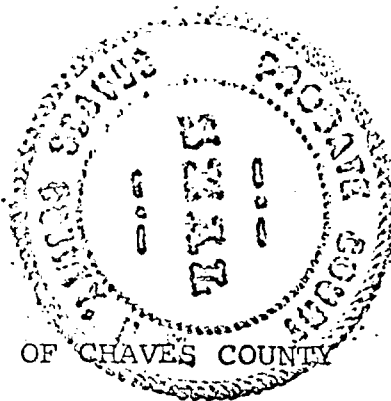

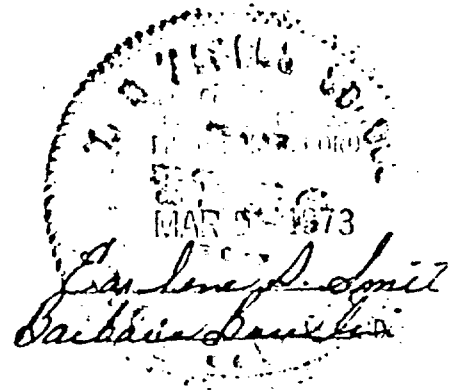

FINAL DECREE

This matter came on to be heard, and the Court having heard the evidence and considered all instruments filed herein, finds:

1. Due service of process has been had upon all parties interested in this estate, and the Court has jurisdiction of the subject matter hereof and the parties hereto.

2. Earl G. Levick died testate November 17, 1971; at the time of his death he was a resident of and domiciled in Chaves County, New Mexico. His Last Will and Testament dated February 6, 1960, was duly admitted to probate herein.

3. The Executrix was appointed by this Court and gave notice of her appointment as required by law; the period for filing claims has expired. The expenses of the decedent's last illness and funeral have been paid. This estate was inventoried and appraised, and the Succession Tax due the State of New Mexico has been paid, all as required by law.

4. Earl G. Levick was married only one time and that marriage was to Minnie Scott Levick on December 18, 1920. The only children of the decedent were and are his son, Kenneth S. Levick and his daughter, Frances M. Schmidt. He had no heir by adoption. The sole and only heirs-at-law, devisees and legatees of the decedent are his wife, Minnie Scott Levick and his son, Kenneth S. Levick and daughter,

Frances M. Schmidt, and they are entitled to the property of the decedent, as provided by the terms of his Will.

5. The Executrix has received and expended no monies in connection with this administration, all expenditures having been made by her from her personal funds. All the heirs, legatees and devisees have waived any formal accounting by the Executrix. The property described in the Inventory remains unexpended or unappropriated.


6. No objections have been filed herein, and the Final Account and Report of the Executrix should be approved by the Court. This estate has been fully administered as required by law and the Executrix should be discharged.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED, ADJUDGED AND DECREED:

(a) Earl G. Levick died testate on November 17, 1971, leaving as his sole and only heirs-at-law, devisees and legatees, his wife, Minnie Scott Levick, his son, Kenneth S. Levick and his daughter, Frances M. Schmidt; and they are entitled to all of his property as provided by his Will; and the Executrix shall so distribute all personal property.



(b) The Final Account and Report of the Executrix is in all things allowed and approved; this estate has been administered as required by law; and the Executrix is hereby discharged.
