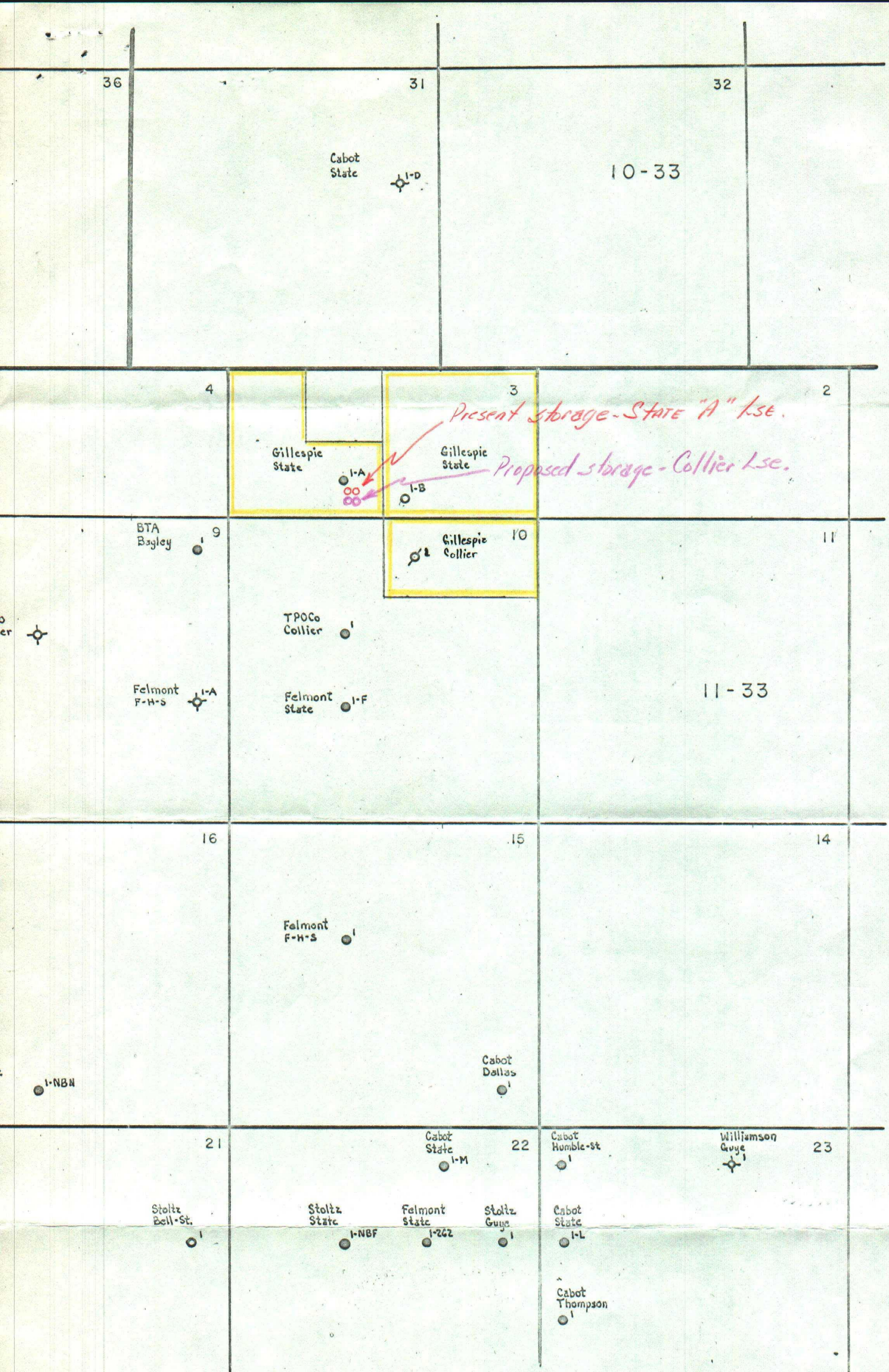

Dear Sir:

I would like for this letter to constitute my formal request for Oil Conservation Commission approval of Off-lease storage for the well to be known as the Charles B. Gillespie, Jr. # 1 Collier which will be located 2130' FEL and 660' FNL, Section 10, T-11-S, R-33-E, Lea County.

I would propose that the tank battery be located in Unit N of Section 3, T-11-S, R-33-E. There will be no co-mingling of any kind. Storage will be kept in separate tanks, and production will be into separate vessels.

The reason for this request is that the present holder of the grazing leases of the acreage involved has requested that, if possible, all batteries be placed in a central location in order not to use as much land. Of course, his reasoning is based on the present condition of his grass, and he needs as much grass as possible.

I appreciate your consideration of this request and hope for a favorable reply.
