Gentlemen:

Administrative Order PC-26 granted TEXACO Inc. exception to Rule 303 (a) of the Commission Rules and Regulations to permit the commingling of the oil production from the East Caprock-Devonian Pool and an undesignated Wolfcamp pool and an undesignated Pennsylvanian pool from all wells presently completed or hereafter drilled on TEXACO Inc.'s State of New Mexico "BH" (NCT-1) Lease, comprising the NW/4 of Section 11, T-12-S, R-32-E, Lea County, New Mexico after separately metering the production from each pool.

After receiving permission to commingle, TEXACO Inc. was not successful in obtaining Wolfcamp production following workover of State of New Mexico "BH" (NCT-1) Well No. 3, the only well available on the subject lease for such production. However, Pennsylvanian production was obtained from this well, but it developed that the Pennsylvanian was a gas-distillate

reservoir instead of an oil reservoir. In view of this development, the distillate is being sold to pipeline from a battery separate from the Devonian oil, thus not effecting commingling. Also, TEXACO Inc. does not anticipate drilling on the subject lease to obtain Pennsylvanian or Wolfcamp production.

TEXACO Inc. appreciates having received approval for the cited commingling, but, in view of the above mentioned facts, it is hereby requested that Administrative Order PC-26 be cancelled.
