Gentlemen:

Sinclair Oil & Gas Company respectfully requests administrative approval to commingle the oil produced from the Wants (Abo) Pool with the distillate produced from the Tubbs and Blinebry Gas Pools on its Roy Barton lease, the S/2 and the NW/4 of the NE/4 Section 23, T-21-S, R-37-E, Lea County. New Mexico.

The API gravities and the respective values of the oil and distillate are shown below:

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canable buy The commercial value of the commingled production, the gravity of which will be 40.7° API, will be \$3.01 per barrel and will not be less than the sum of the values of the production from each source of common supply.

It is further requested that the commingling be allowed without metering as the production from all sources of supply is marginal, and ownership of all zones is common.

Distillate production from the gas pools is very erratic, producing measurable amounts only when the allowed gas production is fairly large. However the daily average distillate production from the Tubbs during the year 1961 was 1.66 BPD, and from the Blinebry was 1.29 BPD.

The attached plat shows the location of wells on the subject lease and the pools from which each well is producing.
