Sinclair Oil & Gas Company requests an exception to Statewide Rule 303 and administrative approval to permit commingling of oil produced from the Wantz Abo and Blinebry Oil Pools and distillate production from the Tubbs Gas Pool on the Roy Barton lease located in the S/2 and the NW/4 NE/4 Section 23, T-21-S, R-37-E, Lea County, New Mexico.

Administrative Order PC-66 dated March 1, 1962, granted permission to commingle the Wantz Abo oil production with distillate produced from the Tubbs and Blinebry Gas Pools. It is requested that this order be cancelled as the Blinebry gas well has been recompleted as a Blinebry oil producer.

The Blinebry is top allowable whereas the Wantz Abo production is marginal and the distillate production is very erratic averaging 7 barrels per day in July and 1.5 barrels per day during the first six months of 1964. It is proposed to meter the production from the Blinebry Cil and use the subtraction method to determine the Wantz Abo and Tubb production. The individual well production is to be apportioned by periodic well tests as required by the Commission. Well tests are to be accomplished by metering.

The gravity of the Blinebry Oil is 390 API and is valued at \$2.99 per barrel. The Wantz Abo Oil is 39.90 API and valued at \$2.99. The Tubb Gas distillate is 66.7° and valued at \$2.79 per barrel. The commercial value of the commingled production is calculated to be not less than the sum of the values of the production from each source.

An early approval of this application will be appreciated.




