Gentlemen:

P Reference is made to your application dated August 10, 1962, for administrative approval of an exception to Rule 303 (a) to permit the construction of two separate commingling facilities on your State "AJ" Lease comprising the SW/4 of Section 30, Township 25 South, Range 38 East, NMPM, Lea County, New Mexico. We have just received copy of approval by the Commissioner of Public Lands to your proposed commingling installations.

Y The first such installation is to be for the commingling of sweet crudes produced from the Blinebry, Fusselman and Tubb Pools, Justis Field, and would be accomplished after separately metering the Blinebry and Tubb liquids and determining the Fusselman production by means of the subtraction method. The second such installation would be a sour tank battery for the commingling of Blinebry production from your State "AJ" Well No. 6 and Langlie Mattix production, and would be accomplished without separately metering the production from either pool and allocating the production on the basis of periodic well tests.

By the authority vested in me under the provisions of Rule 303 (b) of the Commission Rules and Regulations, you are hereby authorized to commingle the production from the aforesaid pools on said lease in the above-described manner. Provided however, that the installation shall be operated in accordance with the provisions of the Commission "Manual for the Installation and

SANTA FE CONSERVATION COMMISSION
FOR THE YEAR 1925-1926

The Commission was organized on July 1, 1925, and has since that time been engaged in a study of the natural resources of the Santa Fe National Forest. The Commission has held numerous public hearings and has received many suggestions from the public. It has also conducted extensive field work and has collected a large amount of data. The Commission has the honor to submit herewith its report for the year 1925-1926.

The Commission has found that the natural resources of the Santa Fe National Forest are being rapidly depleted. The Commission has therefore recommended that the following measures be taken to conserve the natural resources of the forest:

1. The establishment of a system of public lands management.
2. The protection of the forest from fire, insect, and disease.
3. The regulation of the use of the forest.
4. The conservation of the forest's wildlife.
5. The preservation of the forest's scenic and historic values.

The Commission believes that these measures are essential for the preservation of the natural resources of the Santa Fe National Forest. It urges the prompt adoption of these measures by the proper authorities.
