Reference is made to your letter of September 19, 1962, wherein you request authority for Pioneer Production Corporation to commingle the gas well liquids produced from the Basin-Dakota Gas Pool and the Flora Vista-Mesaverde Gas Pool by its Johnston Well No. 1, located in the SE/4 of Section 28, Township 30 North, Range 12 West, San Juan County, New Mexico, and allocating the production to each of the two zones of the dual completion on the basis of periodic well tests.

Pioneer Production Corporation is hereby authorized to so commingle the production as outlined above and in conformance with the Commission "Manual for the Installation and Operation of Commingling Facilities."
