Gentlemen:

Reference is made to your application dated December 4, 1962, for administrative approval of an exception to Rule 303 (a) of the Commission Rules and Regulations to permit the commingling of Blinebry and Drinkard oil pool production on your F. F. Hardison "B" Lease comprising the SE/4 of Section 27 and the NE/4 of Section 34, Township 21 South, Range 37 East, Lea County, New Mexico, after separately metering the production from the Blinebry Oil Pool and determining the Drinkard production by means of the subtraction method.

By the authority vested in me under the provisions of Rule 303 (b) of the Commission Rules and Regulations, you are hereby authorized to commingle the production from the aforesaid pools on said lease in the above-described manner. Provided however, that the installation shall be operated in accordance with the provisions of the Commission "Manual for the Installation and Operation of Commingling Facilities," including the requirement for non-reset counters on the meters.
