Gentlemen:

Reference is made to your application dated August 10, 1964, for administrative approval of an exception to Rule 303 (a) of the Commission Rules and Regulations to permit the commingling of Glorieta and San Andres production on your State H lease comprising the NW/4 SW/4 of Section 29, Township 17 South, Range 35 East, Vacuum Field, Lea County, New Mexico, after separately metering the Glorieta production and determining the San Andres production by means of the subtraction method.

By the authority vested in me under the provisions of Rule 303 (b) of the Commission Rules and Regulations, you are hereby authorized to commingle the production from the aforesaid pools on said lease in the above-described manner. Provided however, that the installation shall be operated in accordance with the provisions of the Commission "Manual for the Installation and Operation of Commingling Facilities," including the requirement for non-reset counters on the meters. Please notify the Hobbs District Office of the Commission at such time as this installation is complete in order that an inspection may be made of the installation prior to putting it in operation.

JOHN W. WILSON, JR. was born on May 1, 1891, at
St. Louis, Missouri. He was the son of John W. Wilson, Sr.
and Mary Elizabeth Wilson. He was educated at the
University of Missouri, St. Louis, where he received
his B.S. degree in 1913. He then served in the
United States Army from 1917 to 1919. After the war
he returned to St. Louis and worked for the
Missouri Pacific Railroad. In 1921 he married
Elizabeth Wilson. They had three children: John W.
Wilson, III, born in 1922; Mary Elizabeth Wilson,
born in 1924; and William Wilson, born in 1926.
John W. Wilson, Jr. died on May 1, 1961, at
St. Louis, Missouri. He was 70 years old at the time
of his death. He was buried in the St. Louis
Catholic Cemetery.
