Re: Application to commingle Drinkard, Terry Blinebry, and Hare-Simpson production on the Aztec Oil & Gas Company "State" Lease B-11613.

Gentlemen:

Aztec Oil & Gas Company respectfully requests an exception to Rule 303 (a) and administrative approval to commingle Drinkard, Terry Blinebry and Hare-Simpson production on the "State" Lease located in Lot 13, of Section 2, Township 21 South, Range 37 East, Lea County, New Mexico, by allocating the production on the basis of periodic well tests, as none of the wells on this lease is capable of producing top allowable.

The following facts are pertinent to this request:

- 1. Aztec Oil & Gas Company is the owner and operator of the above described lease.
- 2. This lease, State of New Mexico Lease B-11613, involves State lands; therefore, evidence that the Commissioner of Public Lands for the State of New Mexico has consented to the proposed commingling is attached to this application.
- 3. A schematic diagram of the proposed installation is attached.
- 4. A plat showing the location of all wells on the subject lease and the pool from which each well is produced is attached.
- 5. The average daily production during July and August, 1964, the known gravities, and the value of each common source of supply are herein tabulated:

- 6. The expected gravity of the commingled liquid hydrocarbon production is 38.5 ° API. The daily value of 41.56 barrels with a gravity of 38.5 ° API at \$2.89 per barrel is \$120.11, which is \$0.06 less than the sum of the values of the production from each common source of supply.
- 7. Although the daily revenue will be \$0.05 less if these three common sources of supply are commingled, we believe that this application is in the interest of economics because of the reduced operating costs and salvageable materials envolved.

Your approval of this application will be appreciated.


