COMMINGLING PERMIT VAC EDGE UNIT VACUUM FIELD Lea County, New Mexico

Gentlemen:

Standard Oil Company of Texas, a Division of California Oil Company, respectfully requests administrative approval to commingle Glorieta production now being developed on the Vac Edge Unit lease with Abo production from the same lease. All wells will be within the Vac Edge Unit, which is located in Sections 3, 4, 5, 9, and 10, Township 18 S, Range 35 E, Lea County, New Mexico. Working and royalty interests of the commingled production are identical with Standard Oil Company of Texas as the operator of the Unit. Following is a resume of this production:

The combined production should average 2050 BOPD of 390 oil at a value of \$2.99 per barrel so there will be no loss of value by commingling the zones.

At the present time there are eighteen Abo producers in the Unit and all production is processed through a central battery and is sold from an ACT unit. The Vac Edge 1-G (Glorieta) well is now being completed and it is proposed to set a heater-treater at the central battery to process Glorieta production. Glorieta oil will dump through a non-resetable positive displacement meter into the run tank at the central battery. It is now expected that two Glorieta wells will be drilled within the Unit. A metering separator will be installed for testing when the second Glorieta well is completed.

Glorieta production will be metered and Abo production will be determined by subtraction. Production will be prorated to individual wells by periodic well tests utilizing metering separators for each zone.

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Attached are a copy of a Purchaser's Waiver which is being sent to Texas-New Mexico Pipeline Company, a Lease Plat showing existing Unit wells and the proposed completion, and a drawing of the proposed changes at the central battery. This information is being sent for your earliest consideration. We anticipate early approval of the attached Waiver and will transmit a copy of the executed document as soon as it is received.

A copy of this application is also being sent to the Commissioner of Public Lands for the State of New Mexico for his approval.

Please advise if you desire additional information in regard to this proposal.
