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Gentlemen:

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Reference is made to your application dated April 23, 1965, for administrative approval of an exception to Rule 303 (a) of the Commission's Rules and Regulations to permit the commingling of Bone Spring and Pennsylvanian production on your Mahaffey-Federal Lease comprising the NW/4 of Section 14, Township 20 South, Range 33 East, Teas Field, Lea County, New Mexico, allocating the production on the basis of periodic well tests. It is our understanding that all wells in both pools on said lease are of marginal nature.

By the authority vested in me under the provisions of Rule 303 (b) of the Commission's Rules and Regulations, you are hereby authorized to commingle the production from the aforesaid pools on said lease in the above-described manner. Provided, however, that the installation shall be operated in accordance with the provisions of the Commission's "Manual for the Installation and Operation of Commingling Facilities," and provided further, that you shall notify the Commission at such time as any well in either of the aforesaid pools is capable of top allowable production.
