Gentlemen:

Reference is made application dated April 14, 1965, for administrative approval of an exception to Rule 303 (a) of the Commission Rules and Regulations to permit the commingling of distillate produced from the Basin Dakota and Blanco Mesaverde Gas Pools from your Jicarilla A-1 Well in Section 18, Township 26 North, Range 5 West, Rio Arriba County, New Mexico, allocating the production on the basis of periodic well tests. It is our understanding that the average production from the Dakota is approximately 37.7 barrels of condensate per million cubic feet and the Mesaverde produces approximately 23 barrels per million. Further, that the ownership of both zones is identical throughout.

By the authority vested in me under the provisions of Rule 303 (b) of the Commission's Rules and Regulations, you are hereby authorized to commingle the condensate production from the aforesaid pools on said lease in the above described manner. Provided however, that the installation shall be operated in accordance with the provisions of the Commission's Manual for the Installation and Operation of Commingling Facilities,
