

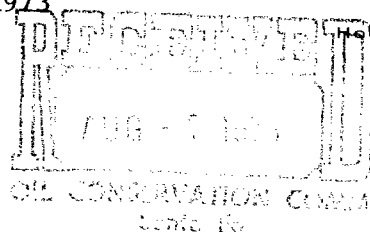

Dear Sir:

Your administrative approval is requested to amend Administrative Order PC-277 to permit the commingling of Penrose Skelly and Tubb oil production on our W. T. McComack lease, comprising the E/2 of section 32, 21-S, 37-E, Lea County, New Mexico. PC-277 authorized commingling the Blinebry and Penrose Skelly oil zones.

The Blinebry oil zone has been abandoned on this lease and well No. 17 has been completed in the Tubb oil. This well is now producing approximately 30 BOPD with a corrected gravity of 38.7°. The Penrose Skelly production on this lease has declined to approximately 2 BOPD, which will result in a negligible effect to the lease income due to commingling these zones.

Attached is a letter from Shell Oil Company agreeing to purchase the commingled production.

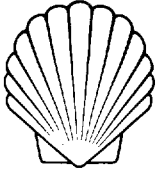
