Gentlemen:

Reference is made to your applications of December 3, 1965, for an exception to Commission Rule 303 (a) of the Commission Rules and Regulations to permit the commingling of condensate produced from the Basin-Dakota gas pool and the Blanco-Mesaverde gas pool from the following wells in San Juan County, New Mexico:

It is our understanding that you propose to allocate the condensate production back to each zone according to gas-oil ratio tests which will be taken each 6 months and reported on Commission Form C-115 and that the ownership is common between the two zones in each case.

By the authority vested in me under the provisions of Rule 303 (b) of the Commission Rules and Regulations, you are hereby authorized to commingle the production from the aforesaid pools and wells in the above-described manner. Provided, however, that the installation shall be operated in accordance with the provisions of the Commission "Manual for Installation and Operation of Commingling Facilities," and provided further, that the gas from each zone shall continue to be metered separately.
