Dear Mr. Thompson:

Reference is made to the following: (i) your application on behalf of the operator, Williams Production Company ("Williams") that was submitted to the New Mexico Oil Conservation Division ("Division") on August 3, 2001 (reference No. pKRV0121853832); and (ii) the Division's records in Aztec and Santa Fe: all concerning Williams's request for an exception to the well location requirements provided within the "Special Rules and Regulations for the Basin-Dakota Pool," as promulgated by Division Order No. R-10987-B, issued in Case No. 12290 dated June 30, 2000, as amended by Division Order No. R-10987-B (1), dated August 10, 2000, for a non-standard infill gas well location within an existing standard 320-acre stand-up gas spacing and proration unit for the Basin-Dakota Pool comprising the E/2 of Section 32, Township 31 North, Range 5 West, NMPM, Rio Arriba County, New Mexico. This unit is currently dedicated to Williams's Rosa Unit Well No. 26-A (API No. 30-039-25580), located at a standard gas well location 860 feet from the South line and 1465 feet from the East line (Unit O) of Section 32.

The application has been duly filed under the provisions of Division Rules 104.F and 605.B.

By the authority granted me under the provisions of Division Rule 104.F (2), the following described well to be drilled at an unorthodox infill gas well location in Section 32 is hereby approved:

Rosa Unit Well No. 26-B 1380' FNL & 2450' FEL (Unit G).

Further, both of the aforementioned Rosa Unit Wells No. 26-A and 26-B and existing gas spacing and proration unit will be subject to all existing rules, regulations, policies, and procedures applicable to prorated gas pools in Northwest, New Mexico.
