Dear Mr. Welsh:

Reference is made to the following: (i) your application (application reference No. pKRV0-121854256) submitted to the New Mexico Oil Conservation Division ("Division") on August 6, 2001; and (ii) the Division's records in Santa Fe and Aztec: all concerning XTO Energy, Inc.'s request for an off-pattern non-standard Basin-Fruitland coal gas well location for the existing Valencia Canyon Unit Well No. 15 (API No. 30-039-211475), located 1450 feet from the South line and 790 feet from the East line (Unit I) of Section 27, Township 28 North, Range 4 West, NMPM, Basin-Fruitland Coal (Gas) Pool (71629), Rio Arriba County, New Mexico.

According to the Division's well records the Valencia Canyon Unit Well No.15 was initially drilled in 1978 and completed at a standard gas well location in the Choza Mesa-Pictured Cliffs Pool within a standard 160-acre gas spacing and proration unit comprising the SE/4 of Section 27.

It is our understanding that XTO Energy, Inc. intends to abandoned the Pictured Cliffs interval and recompleted this well up-hole into the Basin-Fruitland Coal (Gas) Pool. Pursuant to the "Special Rules and Regulations for the Basin-Fruitland Coal (Gas) Pool," as promulgated by Division Order No. R-8768, as amended, the location of this well is considered to be unorthodox. Further, the S/2 of Section 27 is to be dedicated to this well in order to form a standard 320-acre lay-down gas spacing and proration unit for the Basin-Fruitland Coal (Gas) Pool.

By the authority granted me under the provisions of Rule 8 of these special pool rules the above-described unorthodox coal gas well location for the Valencia Canyon Unit Well No. 15 is hereby approved.
