Gentlemen:

Continental Oil Company respectfully requests administrative approval under the provisions of Rule 5 (b) of the Special Rules and Regulations for the Eumont Gas Pool of Order No. R-520 for approval of a 120-acre non-standard gas proration unit for its Elliott B-20 No. 1 well located 1980 feet from the north line and 660 feet from the west line of Section 20, Township 22 South, Range 37 East, Lea County, New Mexico in the Eumont gas pool.

The unit is proposed to consist of the S/2 NW/4 and SW/4 NE/4 of Section 20, Township 22 South, Range 37 East.


In support of this request we should like to point out that the proposed unit conforms with the requirements of said Rule 5 (b) in all respects as follows:

1. Said unit consists of contiguous quarter-quarter sections (and/or lots).
2. Said unit lies wholly within a single governmental section.
3. The entire proposed unit may be reasonably presumed to be productive of gas.
4. The length or width of said unit does not exceed 5,280 feet.
5. Copies of this application have been furnished this date by registered mail to all offset operators and all operators within 1,500 feet of said well, as required by the provisions of said Rule 5 (b).

A plat is attached hereto showing to the best of our knowledge and belief the proposed unit, the location of the well, and the offset ownership.


In view of the facts set out herein it is respectfully requested that the Commission enter an order approving the non-standard gas proration unit for Continental Oil Company's

Elliott B-20 No. 1 well as described above.



Gentlemen:

This is to advise that Skelly Oil Company has no objection to administrative approval of a 120-acre non-standard proration unit for Continental Oil Company's Elliott B-20 No. 1 well located 1980' from the north line and 660' from the west line of Section 20, Township 22 South, Range 37 East, Lea County, New Mexico, in the Eumont Gas Pool, in order for them to secure an allowable and be permitted to produce gas from this well pending negotiations of Skelly Oil Company with them to add a Skelly 40-acre tract described as the NW of the SW of said Section 20 and augment the Continental Unit by the inclusion of said Skelly acreage.

Negotiations are being carried out between the two companies to accomplish this purpose; but, in the meantime we believe Continental should be entitled to such administrative approval so as to permit them to produce and operate their gas well.
