Dear Mr. O'Connell:

Your letter dated December 9, 1993, which contained supplemental information concerning notification for the subject application, has been reviewed by various Division staff members in Santa Fe. Pursuant to our discussions, it has been determined that your notification to all the appropriate parties owning interest in the SE/4 of said Section 9 may not be adequate. It is clear the Benson-Montin-Greer Drilling Corporation (BMG) was notified; however, does BMG control any of the Fruitland Coal Gas working interest within the SE/4 of Section 9? Also, who are the royalty interests and, if any, overriding royalty interests owners in the SE/4 of Section 9?

Further, to completely satisfy the Division's concerns that <u>all</u> notification procedures required in this matter have been met, please provide an affidavit of notification. Considering past and present notification concerns that the Division has been involved, we find these precautions necessary for such an application.
