Page 4 (1:30 p.m.) 1 2 EXAMINER GOETZE: Next is Case Number 15652, application of New Mexico Oil Conservation 3 Division Compliance and Enforcement Bureau for an 4 5 compliance order against Westbrook Oil Company for wells operated in Lea County, New Mexico. 6 7 Call for appearances. 8 MR. HERRMANN: Mr. Examiner, Keith Herrmann 9 representing the Oil Conservation Division Compliance and Enforcement Bureau. 10 11 EXAMINER GOETZE: Any other appearances? 12 MR. WESTBROOK: Mike Westbrook. 13 EXAMINER GOETZE: Have you submitted a statement -- a hearing statement? 14 15 MR. WESTBROOK: A brief. EXAMINER GOETZE: A brief? 16 17 MR. WESTBROOK: Yes, sir. 18 EXAMINER GOETZE: You can go ahead and have 19 a seat over here (indicating). 20 At this point we will proceed with the introduction of the case. 21 22 And you are here to make a statement on behalf of Westbrook Oil or --23 24 MR. WESTBROOK: Yes, sir. 25 EXAMINER GOETZE: Okay. We'll go ahead and

Page 5 present the case, at which point you may present your 1 2 statement for the record. Proceed, Mr. Herrmann. 3 4 MR. HERRMANN: Mr. Examiner, I would like 5 to ask the Division to take notice of Ms. Gallegos' qualifications and identification and previously being 6 7 sworn in in OCD Case 15648. 8 EXAMINER GOETZE: She's qualified and sworn-in is carried over. 9 10 MR. HERRMANN: With that, we will proceed with our presentation of this case. 11 12 DENISE GALLEGOS, after having been previously sworn under oath, was 13 questioned and testified as follows: 14 15 DIRECT EXAMINATION 16 BY MR. HERRMANN: 17 Q. Ms. Gallegos, are you familiar with the violations detailed in this application for hearing? 18 19 Α. Yes. 20 Could you please identify the operator as the Q. subject of this compliance case and their OGRID? 21 22 Α. Westbrook Oil Corp., OGRID Number 36671. 23 Is the OCD only seeking to enforce violations Q. of financial assurance requirements at this hearing? 24 25 Α. Yes.

Q. Are there any financial assurance statutes under the Oil and Gas Act you believe this operator is violating?

4 Α. Yes, 70-2-14. The statute reads: In addition to the blanket plugging financial assurance, the Oil 5 Conservation Division may require a one-well financial 6 7 assurance on any well that has been held in temporarily 8 abandoned status for more than two years. The Division does have a rule, 19.15.8 NMAC, requiring single-well 9 10 bonds and the operator has blanket plugging financial assurance. 11

Q. Does the Division post all inactive wells,
otherwise known as temporarily abandoned status, for an
operator on its Web site?

A. Yes. This is available on OCD's Web site,
updated daily on the inactive well list listing each
well by operator.

Q. Are there any financial assurance rules under the Oil and Gas Act you believe that operator is violating?

A. Yes, 19.15.8.9C. "The operator shall cover a well that has been in temporary abandonment for more than two years by either a one-well financial assurance or a blanket plugging financial assurance for the wells in temporarily abandoned status."

Page 7 In addition, 19.15.8.9D(2) lists the 1 2 required single-well bonding amount for each county. 3 Q. At this point I've presented you with the OCD's 4 exhibits. Could you list the amount of financial 5 assurance needed -- excuse me. 6 How many wells need additional financial 7 assurance? You may use Exhibit 1 for reference. 8 Α. Six. Can you list the amounts of the additional 9 0. financial assurance needed pursuant to 19.15.8.9D NMAC 10 for each well? 11 12 Α. Comanchero #2, in the amount of \$8,075; Phillips A State #1, in the amount of \$9,020; Phillips B 13 State #1, in the amount of \$8,920; Phillips C State #1, 14 in the amount of \$8,847; Phillips C State #2, in the 15 16 amount of \$8,942; and Red Cloud #3, in the amount of 17 \$8,100. 18 Was the operator notified of these violations? Q. 19 If so, when? 20 The notice of financial assurance Α. Yes. violation letter was sent out certified mail on June 21 30th, 2016, and a signed green card was received by --22 23 on July 13th, 2016. I also spoke with Monique about the 24 financial assurance violation letter, and as of today, I 25 have not received that requested financial assurance.

Page 8 1 And Monique contacted you from Westbrook Oil Q. 2 Corp.? 3 Α. Yes. What relief is the Division requesting? 4 Q. 5 The Division is requesting the operator to Α. provide the Division with acceptable financial assurance 6 7 within 21 days of issuance of an order of finding that 8 the operator is in violation of 70-2-14 of the New 9 Mexico State Statutes and 19.15.8 NMAC. And if the operator does not post the requested financial assurance 10 11 within 21 days of the issuance of an order, that the operator is in violation of the Division order. 12 13 And is Exhibit 2 a copy of this letter that you 0. 14 sent to Westbrook Oil Corp.? 15 Α. Yes. 16 And were Exhibits 1 and 2 prepared by you or Q. under your direction? 17 18 Α. Yes. 19 MR. HERRMANN: At this time, Mr. Examiner, 20 I would like to move to admit OCD Exhibits 1 through 3. Exhibit 3, which was not previously testified on, was 21 22 the Affidavit of Service provided by myself stating that 23 we have served Westbrook Oil Corp. notice as required by 24 19.15.4.9 and 4.12 NMAC via certified mail, and we also

advertised it in the "Lovington Leader."

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Page 9 EXAMINER GOETZE: Exhibits 1 through --1 2 MR. HERRMANN: 3. 3 EXAMINER GOETZE: -- 3 -- Exhibits 1 through 3 are so entered. 4 5 (OCD Compliance and Enforcement Bureau Exhibit Number 1 through 3 are offered and 6 7 admitted into evidence.) 8 EXAMINER GOETZE: We're also -- you're also 9 going to reconciliate between the hearing statement and the application that you're only seeking a compliance 10 11 order under 70-2-14? 12 MR. HERRMANN: That is correct. 13 EXAMINER GOETZE: Very good. 14 Mr. Westbrook, please --Do we need to swear him in on a statement? 15 16 EXAMINER WADE: You're just giving a statement regarding factual --17 18 MR. WESTBROOK: Yes. 19 EXAMINER WADE: Yeah. We should swear him 20 in. EXAMINER GOETZE: Go ahead and identify 21 22 yourself. Please stand, identify yourself to the court 23 reporter. 24 MR. WESTBROOK: I'm Mike Westbrook. I'm 25 the president of Westbrook Oil.

Page 10 EXAMINER GOETZE: And she shall swear you 1 2 in. 3 MIKE WESTBROOK, after having been first duly sworn under oath, 4 testified in narrative form as follows: 5 6 EXAMINER GOETZE: Proceed, sir. 7 MR. WESTBROOK: Well, I could give you a 8 long, sordid story, but I won't do that. We are 9 currently attempting to put some wells back into 10 production. And the reason -- well, one reason to put a well back in production -- one of the reasons is so that 11 12 we have enough income that we can start taking care of these wells that have been abandoned as soon as we put 13 them back into production, but we're going to have to 14 have enough income from other wells to be able to do 15 16 that. And right now we're not in a position to be able to work on these abandoned wells that we have. We hope 17 that -- but we're trying to formulate a plan. We hope 18 19 that by maybe 2019, we'll be able to have the wells we 20 do not have in production either in production or 21 plugged. 22 EXAMINER GOETZE: Is that it? 23 MR. WESTBROOK: Yes. 24 EXAMINER GOETZE: I guess one of the 25 questions I would have -- I mean, this started with a

Page 11 notice of violation in 2016 and followed through with 1 several efforts of notification. Was any effort made to 2 contact the Compliance and Enforcement Bureau with 3 regard to the situation? 4 5 MR. WESTBROOK: Not to my knowledge. 6 EXAMINER GOETZE: So you've been notified 7 several times over, and you never came to the OCD to say 8 what's happening or to -- or to get some sort of 9 agreement worked out? 10 MR. WESTBROOK: No, sir. I don't think so. 11 EXAMINER GOETZE: I have no further 12 questions. 13 Mr. Wade? EXAMINER WADE: Well, it looks like you 14 have -- you know, based on Exhibit 1, OCD Exhibit 1, it 15 16 looks like there are some bonds in place. What are those bonds in place as a result of? In other words, 17 18 were you contacted -- were those bonds always in 19 place --20 MR. WESTBROOK: Yes. They go way back. 21 EXAMINER WADE: Okay. So they weren't put 22 in place after being contacted by OCD. 23 MR. WESTBROOK: No. No. 24 EXAMINER GOETZE: Mr. Jones, no questions? 25 EXAMINER JONES: No.

Page 12 EXAMINER GOETZE: We'll take your statement 1 2 under consideration, sir. At this point, Director Catanach? 3 MR. CATANACH: Mr. Examiner, David 4 Catanach, Director of the Oil Conservation Division. 5 б I just wanted to point out there is a 7 discrepancy between the application on the number of 8 days for compliance and the pre-hearing statement. So I 9 just wanted to see if counsel can rectify that. EXAMINER GOETZE: Either that or we will 10 11 tell counsel what he can get or what he can't get. 12 Yes. Would you reconcile your days? 13 MR. HERRMANN: I believe we're asking for 30 days. 14 15 EXAMINER GOETZE: You applied for 21. 16 MR. HERRMANN: Oh. 17 EXAMINER GOETZE: So going with 30. Okay. 18 Other than that, thank you very much for 19 coming and providing us with a statement. 20 And Case Number 15652 is taken under 21 advisement. 22 (Case Number 15652 concludes, 1:41 p.m.) 23 24 25
