Dear Ms. Binon:

The Encana 2018 Plan of Development (POD) for the Crow Canyon Unit (CCU) located in San Juan County, New Mexico is not approved as of March 7, 2018 because there is no plan for further development. The CCU contains 12,565 acres of Federal, State and Allotted minerals with only one producing Mancos well. The CCU #701H first produced in Oct. 2013 and has cumulative production to 12/2017 of 243,721 bo and 1,550,322 mcfg. There has been no well development by Encana Oil & Gas within CCU in over 5 years.

Your 2018 plan contains only installation of valves to isolate and de-pressure the tank vapor recovery system for increased safe operation but no well development.

Because of our fiduciary responsibilities we are requiring POD's to emphasize annual work be performed to benefit primarily Navajo Allotted interests but also the general public interest. CCU has four Navajo Allotments within its boundaries.
