3. No opposition is expected because the interest owners being pooled have been contacted regarding the proposed wells, but have failed or refused to voluntarily commit their interests in the wells.

4. These cases went to hearing on November 15, 2018. Cases No. 16144, 16145, and 16146 were consolidated at the hearing for testimony; however, a separate order was issued for each case.

5. Marathon filed applications to re-open 16144, 16145, and 16146 and their respective orders to consolidate the three separate orders into a single order, and to pool additional parties.

6. Those applications were heard by the Division on September 5, 2019.

7. After the September 5, 2019 hearing, Marathon learned of two unleased mineral interest owners and three non-participating royalty interest owners not previously identified.

8. Marathon filed these applications to re-open cases numbers 16144, 16145, and 16146 and their respective orders because Marathon identified additional parties to be pooled.

9. Due to the Division's numbering system, these cases were assigned new case numbers as identified in the caption of this affidavit.

10. The parties Marathon is seeking to pool are identified on Exhibit 1.

11. Marathon provided notice of this hearing to the newly identified parties it is seeking to pool.

12. Marathon requests that these parties be pooled under the single, consolidated order Marathon requested be issued for these three cases.

13. Exhibit 2 is an affidavit of notice prepared by counsel for Marathon that shows the parties who were notified of this hearing, the status of whether they received notice, and an

affidavit of publication from the Hobbs News-Sun newspaper, showing that notice of this hearing was published on November 30, 2019.
