AND LEA COUNTIES, NEW MEXICO.**

**APPLICATION**

Nadel and Gussman Heyco, LLC applies for an order creating a new pool for production of oil from the Delaware formation, granting a discovery allowable, and establishing special rules and regulations for the pool, and in support thereof, states:

1. Applicant is the operator of the Bola 7 Fed. Well No. 5 (API No. 30-025-39841), which was drilled at a surface location 360 feet from the north line and 330 feet from the west line of Section 7, Township 18 South, Range 32 East, N.M.P.M., Lea County, New Mexico. The NW $\frac{1}{4}$ NW $\frac{1}{4}$  of Section 7 is dedicated to the well.

2. The Bola 7 Fed. Well No. 5 was completed in the Delaware formation, with a total depth of 5465 feet subsurface and the top perforation at 4992 feet subsurface. Under the Division's statewide rules, spacing in the Delaware formation is 40 acres, with wells to be located no closer than 330 feet to a quarter-quarter section line. The well has a depth bracket allowable of 80 barrels of oil per day for a standard 40 acre oil spacing unit, with a producing gas:oil ratio of 2000:1.

3. Applicant believes it has discovered a new common source of supply, and requests that a new pool be created.


4. Applicant requests that:

- (a) The Northwest Young-Delaware Pool be created, originally encompassing the NW¼ of Section 7 and the adjoining NE¼ of Section 12, Township 18 South, Range 31 East, N.M.P.M., Eddy County, New Mexico;
- (b) Special rules and regulations for the pool be enacted, providing for a depth bracket allowable of 300 barrels of oil per day;
- (c) A discovery allowable be granted for the pool;
- (d) All other rules to be in conformance with statewide rules; and
- (e) The pool rules be made effective retroactive to the date of first production from the Bola 7 Fed. Well No. 5.

5. The granting of this application is in the interests of conservation, the prevention of waste, and the protection of correlative rights.

**WHEREFORE**, applicant requests that, after notice and hearing, the Division grant the relief requested above.
