MARBOB ENERGY CORPORATION, ("Marbob") through its undersigned attorneys, hereby makes application for an exception to Oil Conservation Division Rule 104.B(1), revised by Division Order No. R- 11231, issued in Case 12119, dated August 12, 1999, for its Zarafa "FF" Federal Well No. 2 at an unorthodox well location 1650 feet from the South line and 2550 feet from the West line (Unit K) of Section 12, Township 21 South, Range 24 East, NMPM, in the Undesignated Southeast Cemetery-Morrow Gas Pool, Eddy County, New Mexico, and in support of its application states:

- 1. Marbob Energy Corporation is a working interest owner in the W/2 of said Section 12 and has the right to drill thereon.
- 2. By administrative application dated May 19, 2003, Marbob sought approval of an unorthodox well location for its proposed Zarafa "FF" Federal Well No. 2 which it proposes to drill at a point 1650 feet from the South line and 2550 feet from the West line of said Section 12 to test the Morrow formation, Undesignated Southeast Cemetery-Morrow Gas Pool. This location will also be unorthodox in formations developed on 160-acre spacing, 80-acre spacing, if any, and 40-acre spacing.
- 3. Marbob originally staked this well at a standard well location 1980 feet from the North and West line of the section but the BLM required the well be moved for topographic reasons and will only approve the proposed unorthodox location for the well on this spacing unit. All acreage dedicated to the well is federal land and the BLM has approved the APD for the well.
- 4. There is substantial risk associated with the drilling of the proposed well and the additional costs associated with directional drilling of the well to a standard location would the well economically impractical and it would not be drilled.

5. The well is unorthodox only toward the eastern boundary of the dedicated spacing unit and the only "affected party" is Como Petroleum Corporation. Como Petroleum Corporation is a partner with Marbob in this area and has waived objection to the proposed location.

6. Approval of this location will be in the best interest of conservation, will prevent waste and will not impair the correlative rights of any interest owner.

WHEREFORE, Marbob Energy Corporation requests that this application be set for hearing before an Examiner of the Oil Conservation Division on July 24, 2003 and, after notice and hearing as required by law, the Division enter its order granting an exception to the provisions of Rule 104.B(1) and approving an unorthodox location for its Zarafa "FF" Federal Well No. 2 at a point 1650 feet from the South line and 2550 feet from the West line (Unit K) of Section 12, Township 21 South, Range 24 East, NMPM, Eddy County, New Mexico.
